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1. Key updates

NEW Arts Council England: Culture Recovery Fund opens for applicants Monday 10 August

- You must [register](#) on ACE's application portal before starting your application.

In first funding round £622m will be distributed:

- **£500m** via [@ace_national](#) to cultural organisations including museums & galleries, theatres and music venues
- **£92m** via [@HeritageFundUK](#) & [@HistoricEngland](#) to heritage sites and organisations
- **£30m** via [@BFI](#) to independent cinemas

NEW Culture Recovery Fund for Heritage

- Jointly administered by [Historic England](#) and the [National Lottery Heritage Fund](#)
- Applications opened 30 July and the deadline is midday on 17 August.

NEW British Film Institute: Culture Recovery Fund for independent cinemas

- £30m has been allocated to the Culture Recovery Fund for Independent Cinemas in England which will be open for applications from Monday 3 August to Friday 30 October.

NEW Reopening of further businesses and venues in England postponed

- The Prime Minister has announced that until 15 August at the earliest, casinos, bowling alleys, skating rinks and remaining close contact services must remain closed, and that indoor performances will not resume. Pilots of larger crowds in sports venues and conference centres will not take place and wedding receptions of up to 30 people will also not be permitted. Data on the prevalence of the virus in the community in England will continue to be carefully reviewed in order to move forward with the intention to open up these higher risk settings as soon as possible.

NEW Updated guidance on face coverings

- You must wear a face covering by law in some public places unless you have a reasonable excuse for not wearing one or you are not able to wear one, for example, because of your age or a health condition.
- You are also strongly encouraged to wear a face covering in other enclosed public spaces where social distancing may be difficult and where you come into contact with people you do not normally meet.

The Chancellor announced a series of measures to support, protect and create jobs, including:

[Temporary VAT cut for accommodation and attractions](#)

- From 15 July to 12 January 2021 the reduced (5%) rate of VAT will apply to supplies of accommodation and admission to attractions across the UK, including museums.

- The policy paper confirms the eligibility criteria for the Job Retention Bonus, including:
 - Which employers can claim the JRB, including clarifying the eligibility of employers that have employees who have been transferred under TUPE or due to a change in ownership;
 - Which employees an eligible employer can claim the JRB for, including clarifying eligibility for employees returning from statutory parental leave, for military reservists and employees who are on fixed term contracts;
 - What employers should do now if they intend to claim the Job Retention Bonus.

Full guidance, including on how employers will be able to claim the JRB, will be available by the end of September

[Temporary VAT cut for food and non-alcoholic drinks](#)

- The reduced (5%) rate of VAT will apply to supplies of food and non-alcoholic drinks from restaurants, pubs, bars, cafés and similar premises from 15 July to 12 January 2021
- Further guidance on the scope of this relief will be published by HMRC in the coming days.

[Eat Out to Help Out](#)

- Every diner entitled to a 50% discount of up to £10 per head on their meal, at any participating restaurant, café, pub or other eligible food service establishment.
- The discount can be used unlimited times and will be valid Monday to Wednesday on any eat-in meal (including on non-alcoholic drinks) for all of August 2020 across the UK.
- Participating establishments will be fully reimbursed for the 50% discount.

The following will apply for the period people are furloughed:

- **August**
 - The government will pay 80% of wages up to a cap of £2,500.
 - Employers will pay ER NICs and pension contributions.
 - For the average claim, this represents 5% of the gross employment costs.
- **September**
 - The government will pay 70% of wages up to a cap of £2,187.50.
 - Employers will pay ER NICs and pension contributions and 10% of wages to make up 80% total up to a cap of £2,500.
 - For the average claim, this represents 14% of the gross employment costs.
- **October**
 - The government will pay 60% of wages up to a cap of £1,875.
 - Employers will pay ER NICs and pension contributions and 20% of wages to make up 80% total up to a cap of £2,500.
 - For the average claim, this represents 23% of the gross employment costs.

Self-employment Income Support Scheme: updated 16/07

- Applications for the second SEISS grant will open in August. Individuals will be able to claim a second taxable grant worth 70% of their average monthly trading profits, paid out in a single instalment covering three months' worth of profits, and capped at £6,570 in total.

- New grants to help museums, galleries and cultural organisations respond to immediate challenges, and offer support to adapt and reimagine ways of working for the future.
- Funding from £10,000 to £50,000. The Art Fund will consider offering 100% funding.
- Next deadline for applications is Monday 17 August
